WHEREAS, NJSA 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination, and

WHEREAS, NJAC 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NJAC 5:30-7.2 thru 7.5 the Borough of Lebanon has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the chief Financial Officer has determined that the Borough meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2011 budget year, so now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Lebanon that in accordance with NJAC 5:307.6a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to NJSA 40A:4--45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law).
3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and NJAC 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenues are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality
5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and adopted in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of NJSA 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

ORDINANCE NO. 2013-3

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE LAND USE ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF LEBANON, REGARDING SEWER AND WATER SERVICE

WHEREAS, it is critical to the health and safety of the residents of the Borough of Lebanon that adequate water supply and sewerage treatment be available, and the future provision thereof be approved, and a contract/agreement for such services be executed prior to the consideration of any site plan, subdivision, expansion or increase being considered by the Planning Board and/or the Board of Adjustment which requires additional water or sewerage capacity; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has paramount control over the provision of water and sewerage services with local control maintained for sewerage by the Lebanon Borough Sewerage Authority, and for water by the Clinton Water Company.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Council, of the Borough of Lebanon, in the County of Hunterdon, and State of New Jersey, with the approval of the Mayor, that the Land Use Ordinances of the Borough of Lebanon shall be amended to provide as follows:

SECTION 1. The site plan, subdivision, change of use, and checklist requirements of the Land Use Ordinances of the Borough of Lebanon are hereby amended to provide:

“As a checklist requirement, and prior to the consideration of any application by the Planning Board and/or Board of Adjustment of an application for subdivision, site plan or change of use, the Applicant shall submit a copy of the contract and/or agreement executed with the Lebanon Borough Sewerage Authority and the Town of Clinton Water Company (or the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection if that agency has assumed control pursuant to State Statute or Administrative Regulations), authorizing, approving and granting water service and/or sewer capacity for the proposed development to be undertaken by the applicant. Absent such agreement or authorization, the application shall be deemed incomplete and not scheduled before the applicable Board for public hearing and consideration.”

SECTION 2. All other provisions of the Land Use Ordinance, any Chapters or Articles thereunder, shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Severability.

In event that any clause, section, paragraph, or sentence of this Ordinance is deemed to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason; it shall be deemed severable, and the Borough Council hereby declares its intent that the balance of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the said invalidity, and the remainder shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. Effective date.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with the law.
