ORDINANCE NO. 2018-5**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LEBANON, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON TO
CREATE A RECREATION COMMITTEE**

WHEREAS, the Lebanon Borough Governing Body is statutorily charged with the responsibility to control and regulate all finances and public property of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has previously created the position of Borough Administrator, to administer the business affairs of the Municipality, as well as administrative duties not exercised by the Governing Body; and

WHEREAS, the Administrators responsibilities were statutorily created over twenty years after the establishment of The Lebanon Borough Recreation Commission and it has now been determined that such responsibilities are duplicative of the activities carried out by the volunteer members of the Recreation Commission; and

WHEREAS, such responsibilities are more appropriately centralized in the office of the Borough Administrator, and will satisfy auditing; legal and insurance coverages.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Lebanon, with the approval of the Mayor, there is hereby created a “Recreation Committee of the Borough of Lebanon”, as follows:

SECTION 1 - ESTABLISHMENT.

There is hereby established a Borough of Lebanon Recreation Committee.

SECTION 2 - RESPONSIBILITIES.

The Recreation Committee shall have the responsibility to:

- A. Develop and make recommendations to the Council and Borough Administrator regarding programs and events to be undertaken for the Community under their auspices and the recreation committee.

- B. Develop and make recommendations to the Council and Borough Administrator for establishing policies and procedures for implementing the programs and events run by the Borough Recreation Committee, subject to approval by Council.
- C. Provide information to maintain a current Recreation Committee webpage as part of the Borough's website, where information can be found by the public describing the Recreation Committee's work, all programs and events being run by the Recreation Committee, and the policies and procedures that exist for their implementation.
- D. Oversee the implementation of approved programs, policies and procedures and carry out such other advisory, educational and information functions as will promote recreation in the Borough.
- E. Meet at least 10 times per year. Keep records of its meetings and activities and make an annual report to the Borough Council. The Recreation Committee Secretary for this purpose, may or may not be a member of the Recreation Committee.
- F. Continue the following Council approved Recreation events: Burning of the Greens/12th Night, Park Clean-up, Egg Hunt, Town Wide Yard Sale, Halloween Party, Lighting of Tree/Visit with Santa.
- G. All requested purchases of event supplies and refreshments and other such materials shall be given to the Administrator at least one month prior to the event.
- H. A proposed budget for all requested purchases of park supplies and equipment must be submitted to the Administrator with written proposals no later than November 1st of each year for following Borough Budget year.
- I. Any and all funds in the Recreation Trust shall be used for the repair and/or replacement and/or acquisition of new park equipment.
- J. The Recreation Committee shall hold one or more fund raising events per year in order to keep the Recreation Trust in good standing.

SECTION 3 - MEMBERSHIP.

A. The Recreation Committee shall consist of five members, plus two alternates. The members of the Recreation Committee shall designate one of such members to serve as Chair and presiding officer of the Committee. They shall also designate a Vice Chair. In addition, the Administrator and one member of the Borough Council shall also serve as nonvoting members of the recreation committee but shall not be required to attend all meetings. Members shall be residents of Lebanon Borough. The members shall serve without compensation except that they shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of official business. All members of the Recreation Committee shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of Council.

B. Term: The Recreation Committee members shall serve a term of three (3) years, except that the first of these appointees shall be designated to serve the following terms: one for a term of one year, two for a term of two (2) years, and two for a term of three (3) years. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for a term of three (3) years.

C. A vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be filled upon the recommendation of the Recreation Committee with approval by Mayor and advise and consent Borough Council. Such person filling a vacancy appointment shall serve for the remainder of the original term.

D. No member may participate or act on any matter in which he or she has, either directly or indirectly, any personal or financial interest. (Children of a recreation committee member or council or any other Municipal official may avail themselves of active participation in any program of the Borough or its Recreation Committee, and such participation shall not be a violation of this Section.)

E. A member of the Recreation Committee may (after public hearing if he or she requests such hearing) be removed by the Borough Council for cause.

SECTION 4 – MEETINGS; ADDITIONAL EMPLOYEES.

A. All meetings shall comply with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A.m:4-7 et seq).

B. The Recreation Committee may secure the voluntary assistance of the public.

SECTION 5 - SEVERABILITY.

In event that any clause, section, paragraph, or sentence of this Ordinance is deemed to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason; it shall be deemed severable, and the Borough Council hereby declares its intent that the balance of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the said invalidity, and the remainder shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6 - EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with the law.

SECTION 7 – REPEAL

Upon the adoption, publication and effective date of this Ordinance, the Ordinance creating the Lebanon Borough Board of Recreation Commissioners adopted 12/21/1960 is hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION #116-2018

EMERALD ASH BORER

WHEREAS, insect infestations of trees are difficult to plan for, based on the tremendous resources that are necessary; and

WHEREAS, of immediate concern in the County of Hunterdon and well beyond is the Emerald Ash Borer, which kills ash trees relentlessly, sparing almost none once present in the region; and WHEREAS, the Emerald Ash Borer is a species native to Asia and feeds on Ash trees; and WHEREAS, the Emerald Ash Borer was discovered in Detroit Michigan in 2012; and

WHEREAS, the pest has killed millions of ash trees in Forest, Riparian and Urban settings in eastern North America, notably in Michigan, New York, Canada, and Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, throughout northern New Jersey, ash trees are the fourth most abundant tree species behind the sweet birch, sugar maple, and red maple; and

WHEREAS, ash trees are extraordinarily common in Hunterdon County, which has the densest population of ash trees in the state; and

WHEREAS, the presence of the Emerald Ash Borer has already been detected in the County of Hunterdon, in the Townships of West Amwell, Alexandria, Delaware, Kingwood, Bethlehem, East Amwell, Franklin, Readington and Clinton; and

WHEREAS, coupled with the devastating loss of an entire tree species, are the costs associated with treatment, removal, and in some cases replanting; and

WHEREAS, being proactive is crucial, as when damage is evident, the tree is already stressed; and

WHEREAS, the County of Hunterdon has jurisdiction over the trees that fall within our road right-of-ways and our county parks, and other properties; and

WHEREAS, additional ash trees will certainly be present on county-owned properties, but the associated costs are minimal compared to the obligations that the roadways and parks present; and

WHEREAS, in the county parks, ash trees were inventoried that could impact park infrastructure, roads, paved paths, and public safety; and

WHEREAS, a plan of preemptive removal of ash trees, preservation of high value ash trees, and selective replacement of removed ash trees with non-host, native tree species has been adopted for the county park system; and

WHEREAS, in the road right-of-ways in the County of Hunterdon, ash trees will need to be removed and a portion of the stumps must be grinded, which equates to approximately millions in costs based on average size of the trees; and

WHEREAS, this does not include replanting costs, which will occur on an as needed basis; and

WHEREAS, these costs go well beyond those budgeted for normal operating expenses; and

WHEREAS, insect infestation of trees is an act of nature and there are concerns in addition to the Emerald Ash Borer on the horizon;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT BE RESOLVED, that the County of Hunterdon seeks financial support for the actions that must be undertaken to properly steward our property and protect lives from the onset of insect infestations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that support does not necessarily have to come from new taxes, but can potentially come from the reallocation of relative existing resources; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for these reasons we petition the following governmental organizations to consider the devastation that will ultimately be caused by the Emerald Ash Borer and other insect infestations to our trees, and the costs associated with proactively treating and removing the impacted species, and we ask that these organizations consider the eligibility of the resources they have available to help combat this cause:
