### ***TREE LIMBS AND BRUSH***

The borough municipal office often receives calls from residents asking about tree limb and brush clean up. The Lebanon Borough Council would like to provide everyone with information on this topic:

Trees that are located on private property are the sole responsibility of the property owner. The borough budgets public money for a single brush and limb clean-up scheduled in the spring each year. Not all residents of Lebanon Borough have trees on their property and, in fairness, should not have to bare the tax burden of providing tree/limb removal service throughout the year for those that do.

The date of the spring clean-up will be communicated several weeks in advance through The Lebanon Lantern, the announcement tab of our website [www.lebanonboro.com](http://www.lebanonboro.com), and the new town sign on Main Street next to the fire house. Branches and brush should not be placed along public streets at any time of the year other than the week prior to this clean-up.

The contractor we hire to complete the spring brush/limb removal will only provide the service for residents who observe the following guidelines:

- Branches must be less than 4" in diameter.
- Branches must be neatly stacked on your property along the side of the road.
- Brush and pruned limbs, only - the town will NOT be responsible for picking up branches and limbs from full/partial tree removals on private property.

### Shade Tree Committee/Environmental Commission

It has been a challenging year for trees! A very dry summer put trees in stress. This was followed by Hurricane Irene, and then a freak early snow storm. As is true with people, difficult conditions are hardest for the very young and very old. As I write this, we are still trying to get our Spring planting in the ground. Postponing the planting enabled us to dodge a very dry summer, but now landscapers and tree pruners are backed up for months trying to clean up storm damage. Unfortunately, some of our older trees will probably decline more rapidly due to this year's stressful conditions necessitating new plantings if we want to keep our town green.

The committee will be taking an inventory of the trees on Main St. Our main thoroughfare has a fifty foot right of way (ROW) - the widest of all our streets. The inventory will identify and measure all trees that grow in the ROW as well as record their GPS condition. Trees that are in the ROW are the responsibility of the Shade Tree Committee.

We still have some work to do in the open space area behind the OEM building. There are a handful of outstanding trees on this five acre tract that deserve special treatment. These specimen trees are particularly good examples of desirable trees, but they need to be cleared of vines and competition. This is a project where volunteers would be appreciated.

### Historical Committee

The photograph hanging system has arrived and we are in the process of installing it in the council room. The system will enable us to display thirty to forty photos. Once the display is complete, we would like to schedule an evening virtual tour of historic Lebanon using our photos and other images from our collection. We expect this will be sometime in late January. You will be advised through the newspapers, our website, and the Borough event sign on Main Street.

In February, we plan to present "Neighbor Against Neighbor" - a talk that tells the story of the very historic 1759 House (also known as the Vought House). The Voughts were hard working descendents of Palatine immigrants. The family arrived in America penniless in 1710. By the time the Revolutionary War broke out, they were wealthy farmers, but they cast their lot with England and attacked their neighbor, Captain Thomas Jones. Captain Jones in 1795 purchased a retirement farm that comprises the western half of Lebanon Borough. We know you will enjoy this very interesting and informative presentation and learn about its linkage to Lebanon's history.

**Did You Know?** Before the year 1582, the New Year started on April 1 (or March 25 in much of Europe). This was close to the vernal equinox. In that year, Pope Gregory XIII ordered a new calendar to correct for errors created by the Julian calendar. The change from the Julian Calendar to the Gregorian Calendar was adopted in 1752 by England and its colonies, and eliminated ten days. George Washington was really born on February 12, 1731! The Julian dates are now referred to as old style dates. Therefore, today when giving the date of birth for an individual born prior to 1752 between Jan 1 and April 1 the year is stated as 1731/32. That is under the old system Washington was born in 1731, and under our current 1732.

## **News from the North Hunterdon-Voorhees Regional High School District**

- 1) In the 2012 National Merit Scholarship Competition, the high school district had two seniors named as Semi-Finalists and 26 seniors named as Commended Students. Students were chosen based on their scores from the 2010 Preliminary SAT (PSAT) exam or National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Commended Students place among the top 5% of the 1.5 million students who entered the competition by taking either exam. Semi-Finalists have the opportunity to become Finalists and receive a \$2,500 scholarship.
  
- 2) The Hunterdon County Chamber of Commerce has named two of our students the winner and runner-up for Amazing Kids in Business competition. Cate Ronan from North Hunterdon High School was the winner for her business, "Angels to Africa". Jessica Bollman from Voorhees High School was the runner-up for her eBay business. Congratulations to Cate and Jessica!
  
- 3) The high school district is in the final stage of its Strategic Planning process, which began in March 2011. Over 50 volunteers have contributed to this process, through which 18 goals have been established. The final Strategic Planning report, which will span five years, will be presented to the Board of Education for approval at its meeting on February 7, 2012. The report will be available to view on the district's website at that time. The district offers its sincerest thanks to the community members who volunteered their time and efforts to this process!
  
- 4) North Hunterdon-Voorhees District has a dedicated autism program for the first time this school year, which is housed at Voorhees High School. The district's autism program affords individuals the opportunity to receive an appropriate education in the least restrictive environment of their home district. This program streamlines students' experiences to access the high school's many varied curriculum options and extra-curricular activities. Students interact with non-disabled peers on a daily basis through integration in classes and peer buddy interventions. Students are also afforded the opportunity to practice daily living and vocational training skills in their home community. Beyond the most positive student-centered educational benefits, the operation of this program results in fiscal savings to the district of approximately \$40,000 per student.
  
- 5) The high school district has partnered with UMB CardPartner to launch a VISA® Platinum Rewards Credit Card Program. There are two card designs, one representing each high school. Once a person applies for and then activates his/her North Hunterdon-Voorhees Regional High School District VISA®, the bank will donate \$50 to the high school district as well as a portion of every dollar that each cardholder charges. 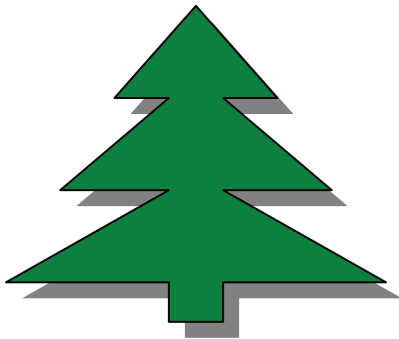

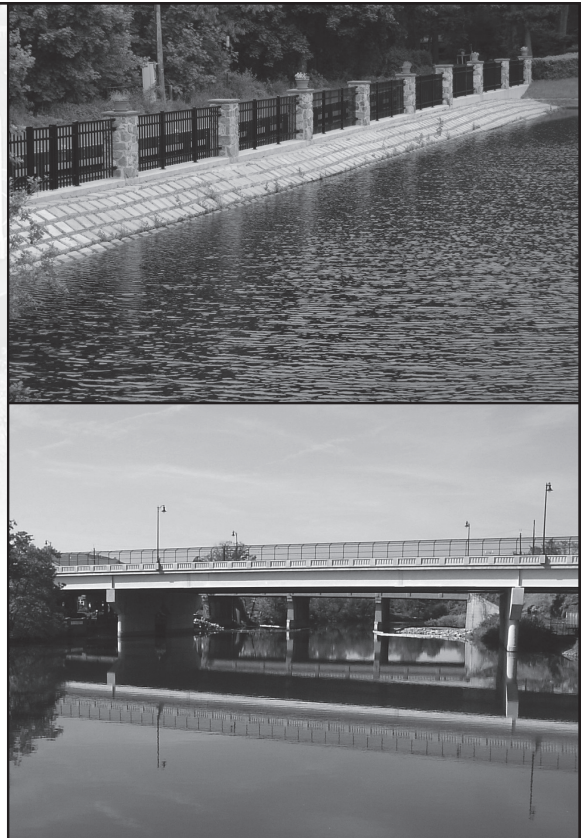

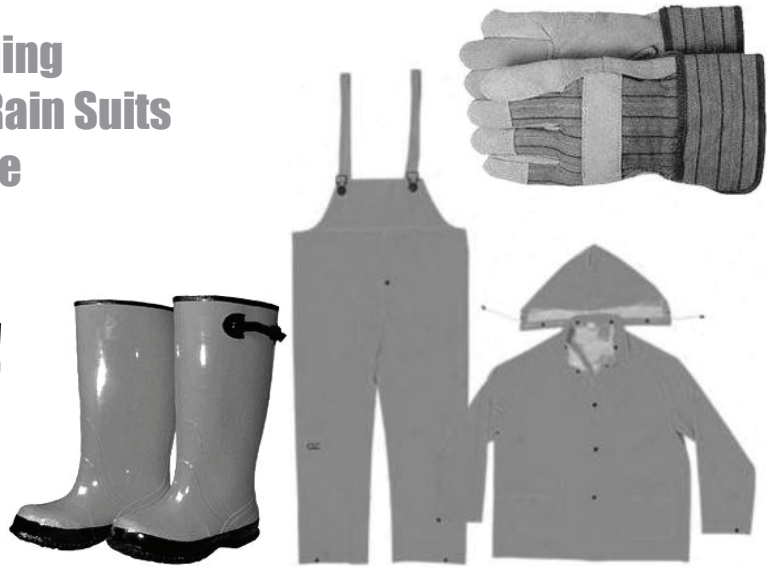
