Dear Friends and Neighbors,

On a splendid fall day in 1863, 150 years ago. President Lincoln delivered remarks to a large crowd gathered on the high ground known as Cemetery Ridge south of Gettysburg to dedicate a portion of the battlefield as a national soldier's cemetery. What he said in the short two minutes of his Gettysburg Address reverberated in hearts and minds that day, and throughout history all around the world. He reminded those present that the American Revolutionary War birthed a Nation conceived in liberty and dedicated to equality, and that now a great Civil War was testing whether that Nation could continue to exist. He urged those present to devote themselves to the great cause for which the soldiers had given full measure of devotion, so that our nation would not perish, but have "a **new birth of freedom.**"

Only 87 years had passed since the birth of the nation, and it was being shaken to its core. Some say that when Lincoln finished his speech there was wild cheering; others say his remarks were greeted with a profound silence. No doubt the men and women hearing those words were sobered by the weight of responsibility and the personal implications of preserving a unified Nation.

In honor of the 150th anniversary of the Gettysburg Address. this year's Lebanon Borough Fourth of July Celebration theme is **A New Birth of Freedom**. 2013 marks a convergence of birth and rebirth as we celebrate our Nation's independence and re-dedication to liberty. What does freedom mean to you? What does it require of each of us to defend and protect it? These are questions we hope will be explored in our parade and house decorations this year Please join us for a day of thoughtful and joyful remembrance.

We have a great day planned for all ages, starting with a Baby and Bike Parade at 9:30 a.m. (registration is at **8:00 a.m.**), and presentation of Students of the Month and the Grand Marshall at 9:50 a.m., all on Main Street. The Main Parade begins at 10 am. traveling up Main, across Myrtle. and down Brunswick. The place to be after the parade is Holjes-Sheppard Memorial Park where you will find refreshments and can enjoy the flag raising ceremony, games for all with prizes, and award announcements. House decorating will be judged early in the morning.

The Lebanon Fourth of July Celebration has been held continuously for 66 years, originally as a day of fun for the children of the Borough, and today as a gift to residents of Lebanon Borough and the surrounding area. The Celebration is entirely a volunteer effort and is only possible through your financial contribution. FLEMINGTON- Bike Hunterdon, an initiative of HART Commuter Information Services, is looking to the community for stories, photos and memorabilia to showcase bicycling in the history of Hunterdon County. The effort is part of the organization’s contribution to the Hunterdon County Tri-Centennial Celebration next year (2014).

“Hunterdon County has a rich bicycling history. We’re hoping to document memories that folks may have tucked away but have not been asked about,” says Tara Shepherd, executive director. “We hope to learn about the history of bicycle shops & bicycle clubs that may or may not be around any longer or bicycle races that took place.” Basically, “any memory of bicycling that someone would like to share,” she notes.

Preliminary research has revealed that a velodrome (an arena for track cycling), originally located at Madison Square Garden in New York, was reconstructed in Sergeantsville in 1932 and operated until the wood deteriorated from exposure.

Historical Committee

Plans are underway at the county level for a huge birthday party next year, which is the 300th anniversary of the charter of Hunterdon County. We intend to host a walking tour of the town and a cemetery walk - dates to be announced later. A book about the history of Lebanon is on the drawing board as well. Did You Know?

The Lebanon Fire Company was formed 90 years ago in April of 1923. The new fire district signed a contract with the Beaver Brook Water Company for eight hydrants at a cost of \$400 a quarter.

Lebanon's first fire truck was a used Simplex which was purchased from Morristown at a cost of \$5000. The vehicle was stored in the large garage on the Lebanon Hotel property until a firehouse was built in 1928.

The Fire Company put on plays and other events to raise money in those early years. One of these was a one act farce called "Snobson's Stag Party" written in 1899 by Levin C. Tees. (See postcard)



The Lebanon Borough Shade Tree Committee

Your committee has been busy this Spring pruning some of the many trees that have been planted over the last several years. Young trees need significant pruning for the first five years in order to develop a proper structure that will ensure that they grow strong and live a long and useful life. So far we have pruned 28 young trees and planted three young Elms.

If you are looking to plant a tree this year some good choices are red or soft maple which has terrific fall color, redbud a beautiful early flowering tree, sycamore with interesting bark and a tolerance for salt, river birch another example of interesting bark. Red oak is a very fast growing and long lived tree, but will attract squirrels; its slower growing cousin the white oak thrives in drier soils. American holly will grow to 30 feet tall, is evergreen, and the female plants produce beautiful berries, and as a bonus deer will not eat its sharp spined leaves. Whatever you plant, remember that you will have to water the tree at least once a week during the hot summer months for at least the first two seasons until the root system expands.

Environmental Commission

All the recent rain will be good for trees and shrubs, but also for breeding mosquitoes. These little nippers are always annoying and occasionally carry serious diseases like West Nile virus. The female mosquito lays its eggs in standing water, a puddle, a can or bucket, even a hollow in a tree as long as it holds water. Little wrigglers develop in several days and can be seen swimming up and down where ever water is left standing. The wriggler cracks open when mature, and out flies a mosquito! Be sure to empty any outside containers that are holding water. Small ponds and large puddles can be rendered safe by the use of a product called “Dunks”. These donut shaped tablets can be purchased at large home centers and are safe for all forms of life except mosquitoes.
