## The Lebanon Borough Shade Tree Committee

It was a very unusual winter and spring - who knows what summer will bring! It is time to prune dead branches of trees, if they haven't sprouted by now they probably won't. It is also a good time to balance out your trees and shrubs. Removing live branches now will reduce the need for water during the hot summer months. You must remove double leaders, suckers and waterspouts if you want a strong tree that will thrive. Mulch is good but **do not cover the trunk**, this is a very bad practice that landscape companies continue to do. It looks nice and prevents grass from growing around the trunk that then needs to be trimmed or pulled. The down side is it is a long term death sentence. Don't believe us, check out "volcano mulch" on the internet.

Any trees or shrubs planted in the last three years will need water during the summer. A good soaking once a week is more beneficial than a sprinkling every day. Don't forget your poor trees while you sit inside your air conditioned home.

Our seedling giveaway was a success with 100 little trees finding their forever homes. Many of the seedlings went to folks from the area, but out of town. The state publishes the distribution sites and other towns ran out. We did have some interested young tree lovers.

**Do you have a street shade tree?** If not would you like one? Trees have many environmental benefits and we need to keep planting to replace those that are declining each year. Street shade trees are those that are growing in the town right of way. These trees are pruned by the town to eliminate hazards. We currently have columnar oaks that will be ready for planting this fall. There are three of these growing on the front lawn of the Borough Hall on the right side. They will get tall, but stay relatively narrow. If you are interested, please contact the secretary of the shade tree committee. If you would like to plant a street tree yourself, please let us know what you would like to plant so we can be sure it is the right tree for the location.

## Historical Committee

We recently received correspondence and digital images from Carol Kinnaird, the daughter of Peggy Sargent Kinnaird. Both of these ladies are direct descendants of Oscar Apgar, who owned and operated a woodworking shop on Main St. His shop produced window sash, shutters, turnings and other millwork. We believe that many of the homes were dressed up with gingerbread and decorative turnings from his shop. Oscar and his youngest son Leslie were both killed in the 1918 post office explosion. The shop building now is home to Dr. Thorne's dentistry practice. Oscar also built the first three houses up from Main St. on the west side of the street. His fine house is the large Victorian on the southwest corner of Main and High.

Apparently Oscar's talents went beyond wood working as one of the photos is a picture of the Lebanon Cornet Band. The drum bears the name and the date Aug. 5, 1878. Oscar is in the close up in front of and to the left of R.L. Apgar, the band leader.

We are always looking for old images related to our borough. You do not need to part with them as a high resolution scan will serve our purposes for records.

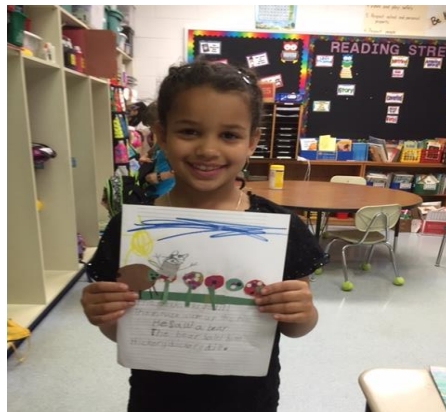
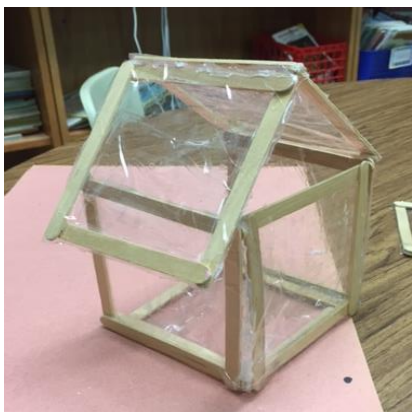
In closing, again, my third year at Lebanon Borough has been another wonderful experience. I have learned a great deal about your children, our staff, and the Lebanon Borough Community. I again thank you for the support you have shown our school and our staff. I look forward to the upcoming school year, and I wish everyone a safe, happy and healthy summer vacation!

**First Grade**

In First grade at LBS we have been working on Nursery Rhyme booklets this year. We learned about rhyme, rhythm and alliteration in various nursery rhymes. We also learned the difference between couplets and limericks. This project was also helpful to practice our handwriting and writing skills. We created a page for each nursery rhyme that we learned, complete with rhyme and collaged picture. At the end of the project, each child wrote an original rhyme, choosing between couplets and limericks.

Our science unit for spring focused on plants. We learned about plant parts, different kinds of leaves and stems, and what plants need to survive. As part of the culminating project we created greenhouses: each student designed and built his/her own greenhouse with materials that were available to us in the classroom and through donations from our wonderful parents. We then had

a choice to plant a small plant or sow flower seeds in our greenhouses. Everyone agreed that it was a great project!



## Second Grade

The second grade class has been working very hard. They are working to develop their writing skills and organize their writing into paragraphs. They have been writing poems, letters, nonfiction and fiction pieces, as well as other forms of writing. The class has also been building their reading fluency.

In March the students created color poems through a writing process. We read a variety of color books and poems. They created a graphic organizer and then tried to list rhyming words from their ideas. Then they put their ideas together to create their poem. We turned these poems into a book called: Colors Everywhere: A Book of Second Grade Poetry. It was printed and the students were able to learn about the publishing process and become authors. They were very excited to see their work in a book!

The students also worked hard in social studies to learn about map skills. They used this information to create a 3-D Landform Map. This was a homework project that they presented to the class. The students did an excellent job reviewing their map skills while presenting their maps. During the winter, the second grade class learned to solve two and three-digit addition and subtraction problems with regrouping. More recently they have been studying measurement using a variety of units. They also learned to collect data, which we connected with science by creating a bar graph to measure the temperature. We are currently working on geometry learning to draw and recognize two-dimensional and three-dimensional shapes.



### **Third Grade**

In conjunction with the 3rd Grade Social Studies Curriculum, students this year participated in the Hunterdon County Cultural and Heritage Commission essay contest: The Most Historic Place in My Town. The 3rd Grade winners from Lebanon Borough School were honored on May 17th, 2016. The awards presentation ceremony was held in the Historic Hunterdon County Courthouse in Flemington. Winning students were invited to attend with their family and friends, as well as their teachers. 183 Essays were submitted in all! The Retired Teachers Association judged the Essays. The 2016 first place winners for Lebanon Borough were Aiden Chen, Ryan Melrose, and Isabella Paez for their team essay on the Lebanon Reformed Church. The second place winner was Marley Landsperger, for her essay on her historic home, The Holjes Home. Congratulations are in order for all participating 3rd Graders. Our students worked very hard researching historical facts and interviewing community residents, such as Mr. Hauck. We are very thankful for those that assisted to make this project such a great success.

### **Fifth Grade**

During the second part of the school year, the Fifth graders at Lebanon Borough School were immersed in the historical novels, Number the Stars, and Sign of the Beaver, as well as Holes, which is a wonderful combination of realistic fiction with a touch of fantasy. What the students found most interesting were the common themes running throughout the 3 novels—courage, friendship, respect of other cultures and races, and doing the right thing. Our school's character education program focuses on six pillars of character, and the novels help to provide reinforcement of these traits. In math, we spent a large portion of the spring learning about fractions—adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing with them! We then took a leap into algebraic expressions and order of operations, which will be good preparation for the sixth grade math ahead of them in September! We planned a field trip for grades 3-6 to the Crystal Caves in Kutztown, Pennsylvania. Caverns are so fascinating, and also cool on a hot, summery day! The students worked very hard on the musical production, Willie Wonka. Mrs. Thompson and the students did a wonderful job on this enjoyable show! Field Day and graduation also provided memorable ways to celebrate the end of the 2015-2016 school year, and we look forward to great things in September!

### **Sixth Grade**

Stock Market Game: For the past 17 years the Sixth graders at LBS have been participating in the - THE STOCK MARKET GAME. The Stock Market Game program offers a vast library of learning materials correlated to national and state educational standards in Math, Business Education, Economics, English/Language Arts, Technology, Social Studies, and Family and Consumer Sciences. The program also teaches and reinforces these essential skills and concepts:

- Critical thinking
- Decision-making
- Cooperation and communication
- Independent research
- Saving and investing
- Letter writing

Students use real Internet research and news updates, making the simulation an even better mirror of the real marketplace. Starting with a virtual cash amount of \$100,000, the class builds a portfolio, researches, and evaluates their stocks. The students will write a letter to their company. They will also keep a daily spreadsheet related to the closing costs of our stocks.

### WAX MUSUEM

Each year in the spring, the Sixth Graders decide on a famous person to read about and research. After completing various assignments in and out of the classroom, we will have a culminating activity where the students dress up as their famous person and present a program to the school.
